- Discuss the different COVID vaccine options for patients
- Recognize, diagnose and manage pediatric patients with COVID-19
- Discuss the presentation, diagnosis and management of MIS-C
- Devise the appropriate infection prevention management plan of COVID within a mother-baby unit
- Evaluate a child with neonatal fever and discuss various options for treatment
- Facilitate the proper evaluation and treatment of a child exposed to maternal syphilis

Accreditation
